WE ARE CHANGING OUR SERVICE MUSIC FOR THE SUMMER, so

you will be hearing "different" music at the point that we sing the "Gloria" and the "Sanctus." For the "Gloria," we will sing S-280, which may be familiar to you. For the "Sanctus," we will sing the setting from *Wonder Love and Praise*, an Episcopal hymnal which is not in our pew racks. This setting uses a tune from our hymnal which is likely to be familiar to many of you, and we sang it for the past two years during Lent. Follow along at S-280 (in the front of your hymnals), and in the Book of Common Prayer for the words to the Sanctus, and as John Wesley said, "Sing lustily and with a good courage. Beware of singing as if you were half dead, or half asleep; but lift up your voice with strength."

SUMMER CHOIR! All Are Welcome! Everyone who loves to sing is encouraged to come to church at 9:30 a.m. and meet in the choir stalls to sing a hymn together that will be sung at the offertory. No vesting, no processing—just coming up at the peace, singing together, and then returning to the pews. Anyone from rising second graders to retirees is welcome to join us; all that's needed is a love of singing! We'll sing only that Sunday's music so there's no need to worry about missing a rehearsal for a future song; we'll be singing weekto-week only. This will continue through July, and then we'll consider continuing into August.

THE NEXT MOVIE will be "A Bold Peace," directed by Matthew Eddy and Michael Dreiling. From its distributor, Bullfrog Films, comes this information: "In 1948, Costa Rica dismantled their military establishment and intentionally cultivated security relationships with other nations through treaties, international laws, and international organizations. Free of the burden of military spending, they used the financial savings to invest in their people, creating strong public institutions including public higher education and universal health care. In short, Costa Ricans created a society committed to peace, solidarity, and international law. They have survived with safety and relative prosperity for nearly 70 years without a standing army. "A Bold Peace" details the events which shook the country to its foundations, culminating in the 1948 civil war and the decision to abolish the military. The movie will be shown on Wednesday, July 12th, at 7 p.m., and Carla Mettling will lead the discussion afterwards.
