## THE PROCESSION TO THE ALTAR OF REPOSE

Additional bread and wine are consecrated at this Eucharist and saved (or "reserved") for Communion at the Good Friday liturgy, at which there is

traditionally no actual Eucharistic celebration. The sacrament is reserved, again by tradition, at an "Altar of Repose," where at Holy Spirit it is customary to keep an all-night vigil in answer to our Lord's bidding to "watch with me and pray."

## THE STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR (all kneel)

All the liturgical objects are taken out of the church as the altar is stripped, and the lights are extinguished, symbolizing the ebbing of Jesus' life. Following the stripping of the altar, all depart in silence.
