Given that we are trying to help everyone save as much of their income right now as they can, it would be wonderful to be able to periodically help they will getting to work. For our working dad in particular, the bus is not an option so these gas cards are crucial!

Do you know of an affordable apartment for rent for a single mother of three?

One of our families **STILL** needs help with finding housing due to a low credit score. She is an excellent candidate as a tenant! Despite being a high achieving, single mom with three kids, she needs help finding a landlord. She has been homeless on and off for the past year, and previously participated in the YWCA's Gateway Program at Hogan House. Thanks to her CCA mentors at Hogan House, she got connected with us. She is currently employed. She has been an amazing employee over at the Doubletree, and was recently promoted (with a \$2/hr raise!) So great news for her! Due to her work hours and lack of a vehicle, transportation is sometimes a challenge for her. She hopes to buy a vehicle with her 2016 tax return. Essential Eats Distributors: Serving hard-to-reach populations facing food insecurity

The Blackfeet Food Pantry

Heart Butte, Montana is located in a remote area of the Blackfeet tribal land. The community has little if any emergency services, and has no food resources in the way of grocery stores. The goal of Love Heart Butte is to provide 100 pantry boxes, once a month, to the familes of the Heart Butte School during the school year.

By fostering food parnerships with Fish, Wildlife, and Parks; local ranchers and meatprocessors, grocery stores, the Blackfeet Food Pantry, and other wholesalers, we are able to provide a high-quality, traditional pantry box at a cost that is economical for us and our donors.



- The life expectancy of a Native American in Montana is similar to that of someone in Sudan, Haiti, or Ethiopia.
- 100% of students enrolled in public school are eligible for free and reduced lunch, the federal guideline for food insecurity
- The closest grocery store to Heart Butte is nearly 30 miles away
- 44% of Heart Butte's population is 18 or younger
