
Meaningful Change Leadership Intensive

She has been homeless on and off for the past year, and previously participated in the YWCA's Gateway Program at Hogan House. Thanks to her CCA mentors at Hogan House, she got connected with us. She is currently employed. She has been an amazing employee over at the Doubletree, and was recently promoted (with a \$2/hr raise!) So great news for her! Due to her work hours and lack of a vehicle, transportation is sometimes a challenge for her. She hopes to buy a vehicle with her 2016 tax return. We have a \$50 minimum for our crew to come out and tackle those leaves that are still piled in your lawn and flower beds. and we can supply a full half day clean up for \$199!
