Meet the Nominees for Vestry

The members of Holy Spirit Episcopal Church will be electing six members to the Vestry at the Annual Meeting on January 28. Four members will each serve a three-year term, and two members will fill out unexpired terms of departing Vestry members. In order for you to know the people who have been nominated to the Vestry, the Nominating Committee would like to offer the following profiles.

JENNIFER ALLEN: Jennifer Allen is a cradle Episcopalian and a life-long Montanan, having been born in Forsyth, Montana, and at the age of 3 migrated west with her family to Dillon when her dad was transferred with the Montana Highway Patrol. Jennifer attended school in Dillon, and graduated from WMC (now UM-Western) and shortly thereafter began a 19-year career in the floral and landscape business—which was totally unrelated to majoring in elementary education—but comes in very handy now at Holy Spirit.
